Have you ever said yes to something and it ventured far beyond the original plan? At times, it can be an awful experience. On the flip side, it can become a pivotal point in time that changes the course of your life journey for the better.

This last year we have seen major growth in both the youth we reach and the team of volunteers who have been giving of their time week after week at *The Bridge* Youth Centre drop-in programs. We now offer drop-in three times a week, and God has given us a dedicated and passionate volunteer team. In early February, one of our volunteers was having a conversation with a youth about their past and how it had shaped their self-worth and understanding of who God is. Through a lot of neglect, abandonment and deceit, the youth had been led to believe that God was a being that depended on us as humans and that he was distant and could

disappear if He had felt threatened by "the darkness". Just a few months ago, this same youth was into Ouiji, calling on spirits, etc. Some really dark stuff. The youth continued to hash out life details and beliefs, while the volunteer simply listened. I walked back to another part of the youth centre to get supplies, and as I turned the corner, I saw something that made me literally shake in my boots. Here was a volunteer with his hand on the shoulder of the youth, praying for them! In the middle of drop-in, with many other youth looking on, there was this holy pause in our midst. It was like Jesus had walked into the room and wrapped His arms around this young person, undoing all of his distorted understanding of who Jesus is, and sharing His desire to be in his life. Amazing!


The reason I tell you this story is because it is representative of what I have seen God doing through our team over the last several months. Passionate people coming together with one goal in mind; to see youth experience Jesus for who He really is: a healer

of hearts and the breaker of chains. Late last spring, God put on my heart to recruit approximately 15 more volunteers by September 2019, and I said yes. I wasn't sure how He was going to do it, other than that I was going to come along for the ride as He directed. It became more than I could ever ask or imagine, blessing my socks off as I've watched such an incredible group of servant leaders come together! Now we are just seven months away from September, and about two-thirds of the way to that goal. Please pray that God continues to call out those who believe in the transforming power of our good God!

teens in Peterborough, God raising up two new leaders for our northern Satellite communities, how we paid of *The Bridge* mortgage two years early, the excitement around building up a movement of passionate evangelists and disciples in our city, and so much more. In our roles at *Youth Unlimited*, we are often reminded that we could not do what we do without people like you and a God who provides far more than we can ask or imagine. As you read through this version of Momentum please keep this theme in mind.

When we have a sense of calling, and saturate our ministry in prayer, our direction comes from God. It's not always about doing what "makes the most sense"

in our human mind – but following and obeying the path that God has marked for us.

We have a staff member who has been running a program in one of our remote communities for about eight years now. This is a mission field that is hard and spiritually dark – with many hurting young people and families. At times the programs our staff run have low attendance. It seemed like local churches were becoming less gospel focused, and volunteers to partner with were hard to find. If we're being honest, it crossed our minds that it might be easier to reallocate our staff and resources. But, our staff member, in close relationship with Christ, was called to stay in serve in this community. Their heart for the youth there is


deep rooted, and their commitment to God's calling is unwavering. In the midst of what we saw as a dry season, God began to show something even greater than we could have imagined for this community. We are now seeing fruit from very broken situations, greater church engagement, and four young people committing their lives to Jesus!

For those of you who have been a part of our ministry for a long time, I write to you with a full heart as I think over all that's gone on these past few months. For those who are new, welcome! This past season, we have seen such a growth and passion in our team to reach out to young people with the life changing message of Jesus Christ, while caring for the whole person and challenging them to become His disciples. What does this look like like?

- 3 weekly drop-in nights at *The Bridge Youth Centre*, downtown Peterborough as well as 2 weekly skateboard drop-in nights
- 3 weekly elementary programs
- FIT discipleship program for teens
- Discipleacity evangelism training and discipleship ministry- which includes weekly street outreach, quarterly PRAISE NIGHT events, and UNCOVERED evangelism training
- Partnerships with various churches and organizations to increase our impact and care for youth
- A network of over 150 people praying for our city and region on a regular basis!

Some other highlights from the past season:

- We were invited to roll out our UNCOVERED evangelism training at Calvary Church through our Discipleacity ministry over a four week sermon series on Sunday mornings. This saw a church of over 400 people trained and equipped in evangelism, and provided the opportunity to go out into the community with our team and minister to people on a Sunday morning!
- We were a part of the official launch of the Peterborough Youth Pastors Network, which includes six church youth pastors along with four *Youth For Christ* workers coming together in coordinated efforts to reach out to all youth in Peterborough with the message and hope of Christ.
- We hosted our fifth PRAISE NIGHT at The Venue downtown Peterborough on February 23rd! Many young (and old!) people came from different churches to be a part of this event and lift up the name of Jesus in the heart of our city.
- We began a new partnership with "Legion Gaming" to host the FGC video gaming community on Sunday nights, opening our doors to a whole new community of youth!

One of my favourite memories from the Precious Girls Program was one of our God Talks a number of months ago. I brought in some magazines for the girls to look over and asked them to cut out who they would consider to be the perfect woman. During this activity, there was one youth who did not want to participate. I of course thought that they just did not want anything to do with the activity, but as we elaborated on it they explained why. Just before Christmas I was "investing" some quality time scrolling through Facebook when I came across a post from a student I used to work with. Alex had been a part of the early beginnings of my calling to Lindsay Youth Unlimited. We met at the Salvation Army lunch program where I served and Alex attended.

After the youth had finished an awesome lunch that the wonderful ladies had prepared for them we would play Ping-Pong. It was a favourite activity and Alex was good at any sport he tried. I'm not a bad Ping-Pong player myself, so most of the kids made it a challenge to beat me. Well, Alex became good quickly and before long we were trading wins. Not long after, I was hard pressed to gain a win. Alex didn't rub that in at all. In the summer he came on a couple of YUDA canoe trips, and I had a consistent presence in Alex's life for three years.

Fast-forward to last Christmas when I saw the post, or I should call it rant, that Alex had written with quite a few expressive words. He explained that due to some events out of his control he was about to experience homelessness in the middle of a Calgary winter. I just responded simply to his post, "Hey Alex, what's up?" His response was, "Can I call you?" I told him absolutely and from our conversation I could tell he was in a pretty desperate situation for a 19 year old young man with no job and no support system. As I inquired about his next steps, he exclaimed, "I just want to come home!" When I asked if he had any money, he said, "Al, I've got nothing." I knew God was opening a door to reconnect

with this young man so I said "Alex if I can try and help you get home, would you come?" His response was, "Absolutely dude!"

So I put it out to my friends and family on Facebook. To make a long story short, his airfare was \$550.00 and in three days some very generous people had sent me over \$800.00 to help Alex get home to Lindsay, Ontario. Our next challenge was to get him to the airport in Calgary. In comes Ben Smith, a young man from Lindsay who is a friend of mine and who just happens to be living near Calgary. Ben responded to my original Facebook plea by offering Alex a place to stay if he needed it. That offer

morphed into Ben picking Alex up, letting him stay at his house for a night and then delivering Alex to the airport the next day to catch his flight.

I just love when God connects the dots for a young man in need, using His resources and His people. Now that he is home in Lindsay, Alex and I have been reconnected and we have had many opportunities to hang out. With the extra money that came in Alex has been able to get his G1 and is setting plans to finish his grade 12. All this was able to happen because

I am a consistent mentor in his life, because we had developed a relationship through lunch program and Ping-Pong. Without the consistent prayer and financial partnership of so many, this situation might not have turned out so well, and quite possibly Alex could still be out there. As a husband, father, son, friend, and employee there have been times that I have let people down. It happens. But I'm not satisfied when it does.

This past Christmas we, at LYU, served

close to 60 individuals with a \$50.00 gift card each. We like to accept only cards, but sometimes people donate gifts and food hampers which we distribute on a special need basis. There was a single family with three kids that had an incredibly challenging year that included a messy separation from an unsafe marriage and home, severe mental health challenges within the family, and significant financial debt. Over the past year we had helped them get housing and provided emotional support and food when needed. When a member of the community came to me wanting to provide a family of four with a fresh turkey, with all of the trimmings, for a Christmas dinner and some gifts for the kids, they were the first ones to come to my mind. Upon me asking if they'd be interested they said, "Yes. Thank-you."

We like to have all donated items two weeks before Christmas to avoid any error. Over multiple communications about drop off with the donor, there was something catastrophic that would happen to prevent the delivery. It was either a broken down car, a snow storm, or a sick animal that would prevent the delivery of the items. I

> was starting to get worried so I took some time to give it to God and trusted him to make it happen. It came down to being dropped off at my house the evening of December 23rd with the food items but not all of the gifts promised. Since it was late I took the last of the gift cards and put them in with the food. I then ended up texting the family and dropped the items off to their place where they received it.

> Last week I ran into the person on the street and started talking about things. They told me that they wanted to thank me and said that due to their marriage they were never allowed to have people over. This Christmas was the first one, since they had been married, that they hosted and cooked a meal for their family and friends. We both stood there with smiles and tears in our eyes.

> I think that the reason I was sweating it out and a little concerned that the hamper may not arrive on time was because of a promise. Not just because of my promise or commitment,

but for the One that I serve. I'm a big believer that God is into blessing with the best that He has because that is who He is. And as a representative of Him my goal and 'mode of operation' should not be blessing others with my seconds or "dented soup cans", but my firsts. My hope is that when we give support (Christmas gift cards or not) and blessings to others, that it shows and gives the opportunity to model God's promises.

Promises such as: "We can find grace and mercy in time of need" (Hebrews 4:16); "We

have been redeemed and forgiven" (Col 1:14); "We have been bought with a price and we belong to God" (1 Cor 6:19-20); "We cannot be separated from the love of God" (Rom 8:35-39); "His Kingdom come on earth as it is in Heaven" (Matt 6:9-13).

So this is why, when even with my best intention to fulfill a promise to someone it doesn't go as planned, I trust that God will redeem it in the end. This is because of the promise that He is, has provided, and shows up, despite me.




