Lessons from lockdown

A season of pruning and new growth

I am the vine; you are the branches. Those who remain in me, and I in them, will produce much fruit. For apart from me you can do nothing. - (John 15:5)

As we walk through this pandemic month by month, the toll on many parts of life feels almost neverending. After marking one year of continual adjustment to change, it feels like we have entered a new season of sorts. This season seems to come with the recognition that parts of our life are different.

Much has been pruned away, and cut out of our lives. Things we relied on, things that distracted us, things that made us comfortable, things that brought us joy. We have needed to adjust to the changes of this pruning. Some have lost jobs, others have lost loved ones, and most all of us feel disconnected and lonely as a result of the absence of communal events, sports and recreation, and in-person church services.

Many of the ways we reach out to youth and provide incredible outlets for activity, community, development, and support have been pruned away. We grieve this loss, as those ways of connection and care felt like they held a sacred gift for youth - and I believe they still do. The group activities, sports, and meals we could all gather around have been pruned away for now. Despite this, we have kept reaching out to youth however possible and within safety guidelines. Praise God, our ministry has continued through different means of online communication and connection, as well as in-person visits, deliveries, and hampers.

As is always the case, during this season of pruning, there is also new growth, new shoots and new leaves. Even with our efforts feeling like they fall short many days, our staff have experienced new life and new growth. Youth are being introduced to community online, and are joining in faith discussions through chat groups or online games. Many youth have been pleasantly surprised that our staff would care to deliver a prize or a care package to their home and make sure they feel loved and missed by us. The new growth has come as we realize some places online hold a space safe enough for youth to engage deep spiritual discussion and prayer as they search for meaning in this challenging time.

We have seen new youth join online programs from remote communities and even outside of the country!

Our youth are inviting their friends from near and far to our online events!

As we all struggle to do the best we can at being Christ to those around us, God is present and invites us to Himself. When we focus on restrictions and what is lost we often feel like we are not doing enough, or not doing what we should, but when we focus on remaining in Him and our branches remaining connected to the vine, we remember He is the one who makes the fruit possible. We cannot do it on our own efforts.

In this season of change, I would invite you to focus on remaining connected to the true vine, Jesus. As things are pruned away, we must remember we are still connected to what matters most, and that is what will allow us to bear fruit. Please pray for our staff and volunteers as we do our best to bring the hope of Jesus to youth in whatever ways we can. Thank you for continuing to partner with us in this work, your prayers and support make this work possible.

Online study reaches more youth

The last three months of community ministry out of Kildonan Community Church have been encouraging and a little mind-blowing. Since we can't meet in person, I began facilitating a number of different online platforms with youth since the beginning of November, and they've really taken off!

One of the groups began with one teen who wanted to study the Bible more seriously with me. We started in November and gradually it has grown to include youth from Northern Manitoba, Ontario, and even the USA! I would have never imagined doing a Bible study with these different youth and being able to connect in this way! Youth are genuinely interested in learning and building into this new community, and then inviting their other friends.

The Spirit is moving! Kids are beginning relationships with Jesus, and joining a community of believers for the first time online. Real connections are being made, and it has really made me change my perspective of "online". I've seen how God has used this technology and new way of ministering to bring new life and that gives me so much hope. When restrictions are eased I believe we will keep this new form of ministry, because there is a real opportunity of engaging youth whom we would have never have had the opportunity to reach before.

Thanks to a generous grant, we are able to provide our young parents with recipe bags twice a month (like "chef's plate"), and then we cook together with them virtually - another way to build community. 
I never forgot these words of hope.
