We read in Luke 19 about Jesus' purpose, "to seek and to save the lost". Biblically, the term "lost" is used as the opposite of "saved," as in someone who has accepted Christ as their Saviour. Did you know that Merriam Webster provides 9 different definitions for the word lost? By these worldly definitions we encounter countless different ways for people, especially young people, to be lost or have the feeling of lostness.

We hear common phrases like "lost, please return," "lost without you," or "a lost opportunity" and all of these come from places of hurt or struggle. For the young people we are called to care for this is unfortunately all too true.

As we read on in Luke 19, Jesus shows us with words and actions what His mission is, but

He also gives His followers a mission as well: to make good use of the time and resources He has given to us, until the time when He comes again.

That is a responsibility that Youth for Christ does not take lightly. We strive to use every opportunity to point young people towards Jesus, who has the power save.

It is our hope that you find some encouragement from our stories as we strive to guide, mentor, and love those who feel lost, and help them find truth, strength, belonging, and peace in Jesus.

## **Finding Truth**

During one of our golf fundraising events, Samuel, the YFC Soccer Program Director, had the opportunity to bring along one of the youth who participates in the the soccer program, to volunteer and help run errands at the golf course. They had a long drive to and from Carman which provided the opportunity for great conversations, opening up a space to discuss matters of faith. This young man comes from a Muslim family and was asking about the differences between Christianity and Islam. At one point they discussed the reason for the Golf Fundraiser.

At one point he broke into tears, suddenly realizing that the people attending the event were giving their time and resources to help raise money so that he could play soccer.

The reality for him and many other kids is that the cost to play soccer during the winter is not affordable. He was amazed at the kind of love and sacrifice that these golfers were willing to show for kids that they didn't know and would never meet. At that point, Samuel had the opportunity to explain to him about Christ's sacrificial love for us, and about what Jesus did for all of us on the cross. Samuel explained that in a similar way, the golfers are showing Christlike love by trying to cushion the costs so that kids can play at a minimal fee.

The young man asked jokingly, "Why don't other religions do that?" Samuel then had the amazing opportunity to point out the fact that it's, "because they don't have Jesus in their hearts."

### **Finding Peace**

Jason, one of the youth in our YFC St. Pierre community, took his own life on February 16, 2022. It was three days after he and his twin brother had celebrated their birthday. This was an absolutely devastating event, especially since no one had any indication that he had been struggling with thoughts of suicide.

The day following Jason's death, we hosted a breakfast at our drop-in center for all of his closest friends and siblings to help them process and talk through the traumatic experience. With many at a loss for words, we basically just cried together and prayed.

Fast forward one year, after a long journey of grieving and processing the trauma, Jason's

mom was challenged with a difficult situation as she now had to plan a birthday party to celebrate one son, Kevin, while also trying to deal with the one vear anniversary of his brother's suicide. We were once again able to step in and walk alongside the family to host a memorial service in the drop-in center, and they accepted.

To commemorate and honour lason's life, we collected pictures of Jason and created a looping slideshow. We also had a candle station at the front of the room where Jason's ashes and pictures were displayed with a large lit candle representing his life.

Friends and family members were invited to light small tealights in memory of him.

Lastly, there was an area where people could write a note of encouragement to the family or a memory they shared with This was a meaningful gesture for the family and created a much needed space to process the pain of loss. Life can be really hard sometimes, but we are thankful to be able to be a support when moments like


