Every day youth are asking questions: What to post on social media? What will they do this weekend? What job should they apply for? Many questions lay on the surface of life. But if we were to listen deeper, underneath are questions around identity, belonging, and purpose: Who am I? Where do I fit? What difference can I make? Our role in loving and caring for youth is to help bring these deeper questions up to the surface, and walk with them in relationship - knowing that the best answers to these questions come from Jesus.

We offer youth this invitation to be known and loved through real relationships with caring staff and volunteers. But even deeper, we offer them an invitation to be known and loved by Jesus - an attachment that can carry them through all of life. Every 'impact' in this report represents a relational connection that was made with the hopes of it being fostered into lasting transformation. In January 2023 we launched a brand-new ministry which has given youth an opportunity to learn and be mentored in all things filmmaking and media creation while being disciplined in their faith. We started the year with a group of six youth gathering bi-weekly to create films, and continued to see attendance increase to engaging 50 youth throughout the year.

This ministry has become a place for youth to find community and discover their own creativity that God has given to them. As each youth has discovered how God has given them gifts, they have realized how they are unique and valuable. We have also been learning about God's story of redemption and many youth have taken that true story to heart. We praise God for what He has done through this ministry and what He will continue to accomplish!

... in community

In 2023, our ministry experienced significant breakthroughs. Notably, we welcomed approximately 30 new youth to our programs, a substantial increase from previous years. We've been fostering a culture where Bible reading is normal and discussing life's big questions is comfortable. Evangelism happens over a meal, a game of ping pong, pool, or video games!

Furthermore, we successfully hosted our inaugural Building Bridges Community Fundraiser, a dynamic street-festival-style event that actively engaged the local community both in-person and financially. The event raised over \$44,000. God is definitely at work in this community.

We raised a significant amount of finances and garnered more than 60 volunteers. We estimate about 350 people came for the event. 2023 was financially, the best year in 10 years!

... in livelihood

Job Studio is an employment and life skills training program for youth ages 16-20. Over seven months, the course focuses on job skills such as resume writing, how to search and find a job, interview practice, teamwork, dealing with conflict, and what to expect when starting a new job. Youth also learn practical skills like budgeting, cooking, avoiding debt, computer skills, avoiding scams, etc.

This past year we have seen unpredictable youth attendance transform into a habit of showing up regularly, on time, and communicating with their leader. These three things are the foundations for succeeding in their future jobs. We also saw 10 out of the 13 youth participating continue on to find summer jobs!

After youth complete Job Studio, they are helped to use their new skills to find jobs, and are given the opportunity for mentorship and discipleship. By meeting regularly twice a week, we provide a safe, structured, and Jesus-centered environment where youth are able to build strong habits and discover their potential.
