BREAKING GROUND - TIME TO CULTIVATE

"A farmer went out to plant some seeds. As he scattered them across his field, some seeds fell on a footpath, and the birds came and ate them. Other seeds fell on shallow soil with underlying rock. The seeds sprouted quickly because the soil was shallow.

But the plants soon wilted under the hot sun, and since they didn't have deep roots, they died. Other seeds fell among thorns that grew up and choked out the tender plants. Still other seeds fell on fertile soil, and they produced a crop that was thirty, sixty, and even a hundred times as much as had been planted!"

The Kawartha Lakes Satellite is in a season of Breaking Ground. Jesus made reference to different soil types in this parable found in Matthew 13. Three of these soils made growth difficult after the seeds had been planted. One soil was ready.

There are 6 elementary schools which feed into the Fenelon Falls Secondary School, representing 2400 students from JK to grade 12 in our area.

God has given us a vision to cultivate the soil in each of these communities which have elementary schools connected to the Fenelon Falls Secondary School. Each community will have its own unique challenges as we work to break ground. It is our desire to see fertile soil in the hearts of our youth, so that God can cause the seeds of His Gospel to grow.

My heart is to see a youth outreach worker in each of the 5 communities that surround Fenelon Falls. Fenelon Falls being the "HUB" (as I like to call it), is the center of the vision because its location is central to all the other communities, having the Fenelon Falls Secondary School in it. Bobcaygeon, Cameron, Woodville, Coboconk, Kirkfield and Fenelon Falls each have an Elementary School that feeds into the High School. Our intent in each of these villages, is to meet the greatest felt need of youth, regardless of what that might be. This may be partnering with the school by volunteering our time, or simply running after school programs on a weekly basis, interacting with and meeting the holistic needs of youth and their families as God brings them to light.

Here is my commitment to you. For the next year, my intent is to Break Ground in each community once a month (more if I'm able) with prayer at the forefront, then taking time to interact with individuals from the community and asking God to lead and direct as this takes place. There are two potential roadblocks that I foresee, and so, I'm asking that you make it a matter of intentional prayer. The first is staff, I need help with workers on the ground running programs and interacting with youth. I can't do this alone. The second is finances. God has been so faithful during this period of time during this difficult world-wide crisis, but without the partnership you provide, it is virtually impossible to accomplish this vision.

This fall, we have been able to open our doors at both The Bridge Youth Centre, and our *new* drop in location at the Kingswood Life Centre in Talwood. This includes Drop-in, the FIT discipleship program, Skate Club and community partnerships holding out the message of HOPE to young people all throughout the week.

"We are so excited to be open for drop-in at our second location," Jon Norman, our Drop-In Coordinator reports. "For two years, the Talwood area has been on our hearts. Even now, right in the middle of a pandemic. God has literally opened the doors in order to expand our reach from our downtown space to the community around 993 Talwood!"

We are also excited to share that with the help of our amazing community partners (Kawartha Food Share, Food For Kids and Peterborough Youth Services) we will be rekindling the food program we ran over the summer for a special Christmas Edition! Over the summer, our amazing team of volunteers and community partners distributed over 166,000lbs of food to 620 families and youth in Peterborough! As we head toward Christmas, schools and community partners will be able to refer families again for a special Christmas package which will include fresh and non-perishable food, hygiene items, and a special Christmas blessing package.

This year has brought tremendous challenges for our community. Many youth are more isolated than ever, and we know that the pandemic has had the most adverse effects on those who are most vulnerable. Thanks to your help, we have been able to keep our doors open to serve our community through this time, and be a place of hope and refuge to youth.

Many of our regular programs and ministry opportunities were canceled or not safe to do in our current climate. We missed our vouth!

But still we prepared, knowing that eventually we would be able

to open our doors again. So I am happy to report that we are busy working out the details to start up the On-Target Archery program in a new home in the new year. I can't wait to get going teaching the youth how to shoot archery, building their self-confidence and sharing with them the love of Christ! Most of us have periods of uncertainty in our lives, and during these times I can't imagine the amount of uncertainty that is present in these young people's minds. Jesus is my rock in my times of trouble, as I'm sure He is yours. As Christians it's our privilege to share this hope we have. So to say I'm excited to be able to have this opportunity to share this hope with the youth who attend this program would be an understatement. Archery and Jesus will be what we teach and share at this outreach.

We are also working on preparations for a Bible Study that will be geared towards the youth who have gone through our programs in the past. This will be separate from the Archery program, and the agenda will be to have no agenda, just to field the big questions that those who come have about faith, God and life.

For Lakefield Youth Unlimited (LYU), during this time of COVID, it feels like we are in the middle of a "youth" recession. We have not been able to physically be in our elementary schools or rent space from the school board and therefore we've had to cancel our Gym Night and all other after-school programming. Access to the youth has become limited due to social distancing and heightened fear. As the LYU Barn is still being renovated, we do not have space to operate programs yet. Youth interaction and gathering is at an alltime low.

Psalms 78 describes the account of Israel being in the wilderness and how God had intervened with goodness towards His people by bringing them out of Egypt using plagues and wonders. In verse 15 it says, "He split rocks in the desert. He gave them plenty to drink, an ocean of water."

Sounds impossible? As a follower of Jesus, we need to be about the impossible. That it's His wheelhouse, making the impossible possible. God is not about feelings or comfort. God is love. We need to love Him and our neighbours and others. As we pursue this, we get to see water flow abundantly from rocks.

Coming back together in September began with prayer as a team as we opened ourselves to how ministry would look without our normal avenues of connecting with young people and families. Reconnecting with the relationships that we have in our community, after some separation in the middle of COVID, became our elementary team's focus for ministry. We came back to the simple ministry of "just showing up" as Chris Jones would say.

Porch visits, virtual calls and hanging out at the skatepark have become our primary ways of reconnecting. Showing up means building trust with parents so they can share how they are really doing, being silly together (one time resulting in a staff falling flat on their butt), dropping by with a caring card and treat, asking students to share something that is important to them, learning each parent's Tim's drink of choice, praying with a parent who is just holding it together, asking students what they have missed during Covid, and just playing together. We are also being given an open door to show up virtually in the grades 2-8 classrooms of St. Paul's Catholic School, to run an LYU program called "Courageous Kids" that teaches students how to combat their fear and anxiety.

We are encouraged by the reminder that presence was and is at the core of Jesus' ministry. We hope and pray for you as you find new ways of showing up in your place of ministry, in your community, workplaces, neighborhoods, families and friendships. May Jesus' presence be in and with you.

So, as we invest in the here and now and plan for the future, we believe that we are headed in the right direction and feel that God has been blessing this ministry. All the praise goes to Him!

Over the past few months, HHYU has been working one-onone with students within the community of Haliburton. With proper COVID-19 protocols and regulations, we have been able to take some of the students that we have been journeying alongside, out to lunch or for a coffee, and continuing to help guide them through life's difficulties and changes. The town of Haliburton recently added a new skatepark called "Junction Skatepark" and this location has been an excellent spot to develop new relationships and spend quality time with youth. Furthermore, HHYU is excited to be offering a new program to teach and develop youth to become more creative musically. In October we began online music lessons for ages 8-18. Each lesson is a total of 45 minutes comprising 30 minutes of music instruction and 15 minutes of "life lessons" and positive conversation. Music lessons are available for drums, guitar and piano, and offered for a total of 8 consecutive weeks. One student started out with the 30-minute music lesson and is now expressing interest and beginning to ask questions about what we believe. This is exciting news! HHYU continues to also support Jr. Youth (gr. 6-8) and Sr. Youth (gr. 9-12) operating out of Lakeside Baptist Church in Haliburton.









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
