NLC STUDENT LEADERS THE PROCESS

STEP 1:

Read through the info in the following pages and make sure your parent/guardian also reads through it.

What will I actually be doing as a student leader?

As a student leader there are lots of different things that you'll be doing! A big part of the program is about letting you try lots of different things so that you have the opportunity to discover what you enjoy doing and where you may be gifted. This isn't an exhaustive list, but here are a few of the things you may do during your time:

- Coming to drop-in once or twice a week
- Running a game or an activity during drop-in
- Running an activity station during drop-in.
- Leading our circle up time. Doing the announcements, would-you-rather, or other things.
- Speaking during one of our Bible times. This could include sharing the message, or telling your personal story.
- Helping with activity preparation.
- Giving ideas on how to improve drop-in and then making it happen.
- Cleaning up after drop-in
- Working with a team to run a whole day of drop-in.

Hopefully that list sounds enticing! We want this program to be a way that you can grow in your faith, as a leader, and as a person. We want to give you opportunities to serve youth, and to explore what you love to do.

NLC STUDENT LEADERS INFO: MENTORSHIP

What is mentorship? What does this look like?

At the NLC Drop-in and Moose Jaw Youth for Christ, we love mentorship. We would define mentorship to be an intentional relationship between an older, wiser, more experienced person, and someone younger and newer to the game.

Part of our student leadership program is that you will be connected to an older mentor who is excited to walk alongside you and help you both as a leader and just as a person. Our mentors want to see you flourish and they are here to help you in any way that they can.

This will likely look like you and your mentor meeting once or twice a month to have an opportunity to connect, talk about life, leadership, school, friends, and whatever else!

We believe that mentorship is crucial in everyone's life. No one person can do this life alone. We all have our struggles, and we are all figuring it out as we go along. Luckily though, we aren't alone. There are people who've gone through what you're going through and want to help you. This is where mentors come in and play an important role.

We hope that this can be an exciting opportunity for you and that this could be a relationship that is deep and really helpful!



NLC STUDENT LEADERS PARENT INFO

My child is interested in this program, what is expected of me?

We are super excited that your child has shown an interest in leading at the NLC Drop-in. Our goal is that this would be an incredibly positive experience for them and that they would come out of it more confident, more competent, and more engaged then ever before.

As a parent we hope that you would be supportive of them in this process. We hope that they can be learning and trying a lot of new things and we hope that you would be encouraging that growth.

Our drop-in runs Tuesdays and Thursdays. While many students love coming to both days, we only expect your child to commit to attending one day per week. If they wish to come to both this can definitely be explored.

Many of our students already find their own way to get to the drop-in. Whether that be a ride, walking, biking, etc. As a student leader there would be an obligation to stay at drop-in slightly later, usually no later than 5:30. There will be some events that may go slightly later and so there may be the occasional need for extra transportation as a parent.

We require parent permission to join this program. At the bottom of the application sheet there is a parental signature. If you approve of your child joining then we ask that you would please sign their application.
