YFC NANAIMO - ADVENTURE CAMP 2023

This Summer the theme of the camp was "Live the Dream". We shared the gospel through the story of Joseph at the Junior camp, and the story of Esther at the senior camp, and we saw God's glory revealed in many different ways. Here are a few of the stories:



Teaching How to Pray:

Many of the kids that attended Junior Camp have never heard about God before, or are new to the general idea of having a relationship with Him. That was the case for one young boy who spoke up



one day at camp. "Who would like to pray for lunch today?", we asked. "I will! If I get tuck bucks! But I've never prayed before... Well actually that's not true, I did pray for the first time at home last night, but I don't know how to pray", the young boy said. That moment was the start of two things - a conversation about how we can talk to God through prayer, and the beginning of that young boy's relationship with Christ in a way that he was able to communicate with the Holy Spirit not only at camp, but on his own free time at home as well. Praise the Lord!

God's Glory Impacting Adventure Camp Parents:

Senior camp was full, but as usual some spots opened up at the last minute making it possible for us to bring a couple of extras. A mother of a teen had pleaded for us to let her boy come. She had lost her husband a while earlier to a car accident with her two surviving teens in the back of the car. Amazing kids, but angry with God. I was unaware of the whole situation but God was. Her boy came to camp and had a wonderful time. This was apparently

the first time he had enjoyed an event since his father was killed. He testified to his mom that even the messages about God were amazing. She was so thankful that she came to church and shared her joy!



Leadership Skills Fostered:

A week before Adventure Camp started, I met with one of my volunteers. She had been a volunteer for camp in the past, and I have placed her as a group leader or assistant in all the previous camps. As we spoke it did not occur to her that she has leadership qualities. She has a slight speech impediment and this inhibits her from seeing her potential as a leader. As we spoke, I told her the reason I have consecutively placed her as a leader is because I am confident that she can do the job well. She



paused and as she wrestled with what she thought of herself and what I thought of her, she turned and asked me " Do you really think I am capable of being a leader?" With an unwavering confidence I answered "Yes!" Immediately she smiled and it was like a new wave of confidence took over her face. She finally believed that her speech impediment did not have to impede her potential to become a leader, and I highlighted other ways she can lead others in her day-to-day life. She came to camp with a confidence that allowed her to connect with her group of kids in a wonderful way. Camp is not just for the youth, it is for the volunteers too!
