
IMPACT REPORT





What is the **Impact?**



Every year we take some time to look back and measure some of what God has done through the work of Youth for Christ Winnipeg. And each year we wrestle with a similar question, how do we best measure "impact"?

At YFC, we are called to people and relationships. We celebrate the quantity of youth we have been privileged to connect with, and we care about the quality and depth of our relationships. Our aim is to create healthy processes, engagements and opportunities to love and care for youth, and for authentic relationships to be built with youth through our team of staff and volunteers.

We are called to be faithful stewards of our opportunities and resources. To steward our efforts well, it is necessary to take time for honest reflection - naming challenges, celebrating successes, and being mindful of areas that may need change or reworking.

It is with this posture that we invite you to read this report. Each number here is a signifier of impact, but it is more than a number. Each number reflects a story, and hours of love, effort and time that our staff and volunteers have poured into youth across Manitoba. Each number represents a commitment to invest in real lives and offer connection, love, and hope, through relationships and through Christ. We celebrate how we have been able to provide resources of care, fun activities, mentorship and connection to each youth we have come in contact with. And we look forward, praying about how to increase our reach and impact over this upcoming year.

At YFC, we choose to extend our resources, love and care, regardless of the outcomes.

There are no conditions attached, so regardless of how much a youth would like to be involved, how often they attend, or even if they have no interest in pursuing faith, the offerings are still given unconditionally. In this same way, youth are given an opportunity to explore faith and relationship with God at their own pace, and we celebrate when they choose to take steps to pursue God and live their lives following Christ.

Beyond the numbers, much of the work we do involves statistics that are somewhat intangible. How do you measure the growth of the heart or of the soul? Though it is hard to measure, these are the places where we get a front row seat to how God is moving in the life of a youth. These moments, of youth choosing to engage faith, are why we invest our time and resources. Each day we are privileged to witness and facilitate holy moments, where transformation of the heart and healing can take place. Thank you for being a part of helping bring these opportunities and impacts to our youth, and partnering with us in seeing every young person living fully in Christ.

Immeasureable Impact

This year, we experienced another big jump in registration for our Senior High Soccer program. For the past few years we have run a weekly indoor soccer league on Tuesday nights in our gym. For the first time since before the pandemic, we have more youth than we could accommodate on just one night and we had to ask some of them

to come the following day. With this high interest in both our Tuesday league nights and our drop-in style soccer program on Wednesdays we are monitoring and looking for more coaches in order to create a second senior league night on that evening.

The growth of this ministry is really exciting and we are blessed with the opportunity of fostering community, teaching teamwork, and helping kids stay active all while sharing the love of Jesus with them. The impact we have goes beyond just the number of youth attending and

includes meeting the physical needs our youth have like safe spaces for play, especially during the winter, and offering an outlet for fun and stress relief outside of home and school life. We also care for their relational needs through coaching and mentorship, helping them to build confidence and overcome



The impact we are having is evident in the fact that this ministry is experiencing huge organic growth where youth are bringing their friends and siblings to come experience the community we are building.

In the fall, we facilitated a parenting class that four young mothers completed. We have been using the Nobody's Perfect Parenting curriculum and have seen it work very well with our youth as it validates their experiences as parents and gives them tools to help with practical problem-solving in parenting. Topics covered included child development, routines, co-regulation, selfregulation, behaviour, discipline, and safety.

Over the six classes, it was great to see moms growing and connecting with each other over their similar experiences.

Many of the young mothers have their children in foster care and completing parenting classes is a requirement of

Child and Family Services in working to reunite them with their children. Parenting classes are a great way to engage with parents needing extra parenting support and to encourage them as they take steps to be the best parents they can be. It is so important to equip them with tools and resources so they can feel empowered in their role as mothers.

The moms left the course feeling proud of their achievements and our Young Parents staff are encouraged by a newfound hope within the ministry.
